


# Parishes of Harden and Wilsden

**Women's World Day of Prayer 2018** will be celebrated on Friday 2<sup>nd</sup> March. This year our local service will be at Denholme Shared Church at 2pm. Men and women are both welcome. On this special day those taking part are encouraged to become aware of other countries and cultures, to sympathize with their problems and to pray with and for them. They are further encouraged to recognise their own talents and use them in the service of society. This year the programme has been prepared by the church in Suriname in South America on the theme "All God's Creation is Very Good".

**Fair Trade.** Celebrate Fair Trade Fortnight at our special Big Brew Event in St. Matthew's on Saturday 3<sup>rd</sup> March from 10am till 12 noon. Do come along and bring a friend! **We will set up the stalls from 4pm on the Friday. All offers of help will be welcome.**

During Fair Trade Fortnight we are reminded that many of our foodstuffs are produced in developing countries where small farmers experience severe poverty and cannot afford basic things that we take for granted. Buying products from Traidcraft we can be sure that producers have been paid a fair rate for their skills. This year Traidcraft Exchange is focussing on supporting "hidden entrepreneurs" enabling them to establish small businesses. Every pound raised for this appeal until 11<sup>th</sup> April will be matched by the UK government.

**Lent Appeal.** This year Easter is not the earliest it can be, but nevertheless Lent does seem to have arrived hard on the heels of Epiphany. The Mission Support group is again asking the parishes to concentrate their giving during Lent on the work of the Church Mission Society. There will be boxes available to use throughout the season as well as our **traditional Lent Lunch at St. Saviour's on March 4th.**

CMS mission partners work in many places, in the UK and overseas, often at the request of local churches. We have undertaken to support the work of Awais Mughal who is working for social justice by helping asylum seekers and refugees in Leeds to improve their language skills. Many of these people have come from horrendous situations and although safer now, are feeling lost in their new surroundings. Please pray for Awais and give generously to enable CMS to continue with this and similar work wherever it is needed.

There is a new letter from Awais on the Mission noticeboard at St. Matthew's. It will be moved to St Saviour's in time for the Lent Lunch.
