


Parishes of Harden and Wilsden

Fountains Church is the name of a new Christian worship centre which will overlook Bradford's City Park. The Church of England initiative, to be created in a former nightspot near the city's famous fountains, was announced earlier this year. Its permanent location will be confirmed this summer, but the newly-christened church will start life at nearby Glyde House next month.

Revd Linda Maslen, who heads the project, explained the choice of name:

"Of course, Fountains Church refers to the wonderful fountains in front of City Hall, but also to "Fountains of Living Water" - one of the ways that God describes himself. And, like water, we want the church to be a blessing to the people of Bradford bringing life, hope and love. Easter also reminds us of our hope found in the resurrected Jesus and how life is springing up around us."

Archdeacon Andy Jolley said, "I'm delighted we can announce the name Fountains Church and we hope and pray it will give spiritual refreshment right in the city centre."

Bishop Toby added, "Fountains Church will have a strong Bradford identity: young, entrepreneurial, ethnically and culturally diverse and confident about holding out a clear religious offer and call in the public space. It will have a mandate from the start to grow and send folk out to plant new churches and revitalise existing congregations around the area."

Fountains Church will have its first prayer meeting at 7pm on Tuesday, May 7 at Glyde House, Little Horton Rd, Bradford and all are welcome.

The Revd Richard Burge, currently serving as Incumbent of Hartshead, Hightown, Roberttown and Scholes in the Huddersfield Episcopal Area, has been appointed as Interim Rector of Harden, Wilsden, Cullingworth and Denholme in the Bradford Episcopal Area. The licensing will take place in September, date to be confirmed. Bishop Toby will officiate.

Alice - With the death of Alice Griffiths at the age of 100, we have lost the last member of the congregation to have worshipped in St. Matthew's at all four of its locations. Born in 1918, Alice went to the Sunday School in Lane Side and to the original St. Matthew's Church almost opposite. She became a Sunday School teacher and an active member of the church drama group. In 1955, after the church had gone through a particularly unhappy period and the living was suspended, there were no men willing to be churchwarden. Alice and her friend Margaret Hemsley took on the office and saw the church through difficult times as the old building fell into disrepair and the Sunday School was altered for use for services.

The church moved again, to Royd Street and then to the present building and Alice continued to serve faithfully, adapting without complaint to changes in buildings, style of worship, patterns of services and changes of prayer and hymn books.

She was a member of the Mothers' Union for many years and served on the PCC, Churches Together and the Outreach Committee (now Mission Support group). She was our Children's Society representative for 30 years. She offered the hospitality of her cottage for many meetings and Bible study groups. As well as helping at countless events, Alice regularly led intercessions in Sunday worship.

In recognition of this quietly faithful life, Alice was a recipient of the Royal Maundy Money when the Queen came to Bradford Cathedral in 1997.

Although she has not been able to join us in church for the last few years, Alice continued to feel very much a part of us and will be much missed.
