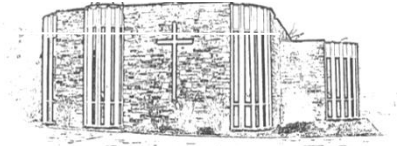
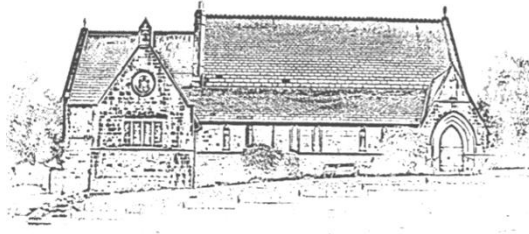


Parishes of Harden and Wilsden

Bradford- A Surprising Place? This slogan was well illustrated by taking part in the September Faith Trail organised by the Cathedral Education Service. In the space of a mile along Leeds Road are to be found a Roman Catholic Church, a Mosque, a Hindu Temple, a Sikh Gurdwara and the Cathedral itself. At each venue we were given a warm welcome by a guide who gave a tour of the building and a brief introduction to basic beliefs. We were invited to join in a communal vegetarian lunch at the Gurdwara. The day started at 10.15 at St. Peter's, ending at 3.30 at the Cathedral; some degree of information overload perhaps(!), but a valuable glimpse of the many facets of our multi-faith city.

The Trail, which has been running for 10 years, is offered on the first Saturday of each month, March to October.
