**Alice -** With the death of Alice Griffiths at the age of 100, we have lost the last member of the congregation to have worshipped in St. Matthew's at all four of its locations.

Born in 1918, Alice went to the Sunday School in Lane Side and to the original St. Matthew's Church almost opposite. She became a Sunday School teacher and an active member of the church drama group. In 1955, after the church had gone through a particularly unhappy period and the living was suspended, there were no men willing to be churchwarden. Alice and her friend Margaret Hemsley took on the office and saw the church through difficult times as the old building fell into disrepair and the Sunday School was altered for use for services.

The church moved again, to Royd Street and then to the present building and Alice continued to serve faithfully, adapting without complaint to changes in buildings, style of worship, patterns of services and changes of prayer and hymn books.

She was a member of the Mothers' Union for many years and served on the PCC, Churches Together and the Outreach Committee (now Mission Support group). She was our Children's Society representative for 30 years. She offered the hospitality of her cottage for many meetings and Bible study groups. As well as helping at countless events, Alice regularly led intercessions in Sunday worship.

In recognition of this quietly faithful life, Alice was a recipient of the Royal Maundy Money when the Queen came to Bradford Cathedral in 1997.

Although she has not been able to join us in church for the last few years, Alice continued to feel very much a part of us and will be much missed.
