


The Benefice of Harden, Wilsden, Cullingworth, Denholme 23 December 2020



Letter from Richard

It has been quite a week so far! Since this time last week there has been a phenomenal amount of change. We have learned about this new variant of the virus which transmits more easily. We have a new Tier 4 added as an increased measure above the Tier 3 restriction level. The freedom of movement and social interaction relaxation has been greatly reduced and limited to just Christmas Day itself. We have seen people stuck away from friends and family and our borders with other countries locked, creating queues of traffic, stranded travellers and limited movement of goods. It has not been a good week.

It will certainly be a Christmas that we never forget! Thankfully, as I write this, the numbers of positive cases in the Bradford area are continuing to fall. Whether that will continue in the weeks to come, remains to be seen. It is though something positive, along with the passing of the shortest day and the shift of our alignment with the sun to begin our journey towards spring and summer. Let us hope that by then we will see very positive changes from the growing vaccination programme.

We have been given many false hopes over the past months. There have been many times that we have been told of better days, normal Christmases, no more lockdowns, only to have those hopes dashed by the reality of the changing situation.

He asked for a writing tablet, and to everyone's astonishment he wrote, "His name is John." Immediately his mouth was opened and his tongue set free, and he began to speak, praising God. All the neighbors were filled with awe, and throughout the hill country of Judea people were talking about all these things. Everyone who heard this wondered about it, asking, "What then is this child going to be?" For the Lord's hand was with him.

Reflection from Suzy

A faithful priest doing his duty and burning incense before the Lord in the sanctuary, I always feel so sorry for Zechariah – he emerges from the temple unable to speak, unable to share what should be a joyful announcement with his wife. He has to go through the whole of Elizabeth's pregnancy unable to speak to her about it. That must have been really hard on both of them. It seems like a severe punishment for a little doubt and confusion. Today we read that he is finally relieved from the silence on the day that the boy is to be circumcised (a whole week after the birth!) and he follows the instructions to name the child John. 'All his neighbours were filled with awe!'

No surprise people wondered what the future held for this child. We all do that don't we? We wonder what the future will hold, and we speculate about the paths before us and our children. It is the root of a profitable industry 'fortune telling' looking into the future and giving people guidance or warnings. As Christians we understand that God sends messengers to guide and warn his people. God sends angels who appear in dreams or in private interviews with momentous news. Many of these encounters are in the Christmas stories but they are echoes of similar stories in the Old Testament and we do read in the letters in the New Testament that God continued to send messengers to the disciples in similar ways. The prophets received messages from God in revelations that are often associated with dreams or trances but sometimes with quite ordinary conversations, during a time of prayer and 'chatting' with God.

It would be wonderful and terrifying to be aware of the future before it happened. Would we really want to know the future?

I have always felt that for both Mary and Elizabeth it is more of a curse than a blessing. The pure enjoyment of each moment is overshadowed by the portentous knowledge that their child is 'chosen' and has a particular purpose in God's plan. Being distinctive and having a driving purpose can make life difficult, not just for the individual but for all those around them. It is a matter of faithful service that both Mary and Elizabeth bear sons who are singled out by God for a mission. They train their boys to be faithful and righteous before God, well educated in the Law and the Prophets, courageous in sharing the message that they have been called to share.

They both hold a special place in my heart, I sorrow for them as mothers who had to let go and watch their boys follow a path that they might not have chosen for them. Aware for too long of a future that they might have been better off not knowing.

We hope and pray about the future. We speculate and we make plans, but we cannot know what the future will hold. Change is a part of life. Risk is a part of life. The most poignant parts of the Christmas story are those in the background who echo Mary, "Here I am a servant of the Lord, let it be with me according to your will."

Probably the most difficult challenge in the Christians life is the letting go of our desire to be in control. We learn to trust God and to allow God to be in control. We must learn to surrender our future to the will of God and pray for God's guidance in each decision and path we choose through life. It is not easy; it can be difficult – but it is also immensely rewarding when you are confident of God's guidance and see the results in your life. For God is faithful and just and He cares for us and walks beside us, comforts us, and leads us. I pray for all of us this Christmas that we may be granted the grace of knowing not what the future holds, but that whatever it holds we will have the comfort of Our Lord walking beside us into it. Amen.
