nearly 26 million people now face acute hunger. Please pray for those trying to bring aid to those in need, especially in the face of great danger.

Food Bank Donations

Thank you to everyone who contributes to the boxes gathering food for our local food bank at Bingley. Sadly there is still much demand for the support of the food banks in our communities and we take help to several families in our villages. You might be surprised at just where help is requested! For some, the need for food is because of low income, but for others it is as a result rather of rising costs meaning that their income no longer meets their necessary expenditure. For all those who are struggling with their finances there is great mental stress so please pray for all those in need in our area.

We are an agency that can give out vouchers to people to take to the food bank to exchange for food parcels, but we tend rather to collect the food and bring it to those in need, saving the cost of travel to and from Bingley.

If you know of anyone in need please encourage them to get in touch with us. And if you are able, please keep donating through our church food bank boxes. There is always a need for tinned and dried food, toiletries etc, animal foods, cereals. And a tip to pass on is that it is better to by several cheap items rather than an expensive one! Thank you for all your support.

Tuesday 13 August	Octavia Hill died 1912, social reformer and one of the founders of the National Trust. At this summer holiday time give thanks for the work of the NT and pray that we may enjoy our lovely countryside with care and respect for the natural world.
Wednesday 14 August	Pray for the people of Sudan. Pray for the small Christian Church there, for whom our prayers are an important sign that they are not forgotten.
