BEATRICE WADDINGTON

At the beginning of the week we received the sad news that Beatrice Waddington had died at the age of 102. Even though it is a while since Beatrice moved from Harden to be closer to her nephew and his family, she has continued to be held in the hearts and minds of people in the benefice.

Beatrice was born in 1919 to Guy and Florence Waddington. She attended Kasterton School in Westmorland, a school for clergy daughters. After leaving school, she taught in Bradford, working with children up to the age of 7, but after the Second World War, felt a calling to become a missionary with CMS.

She served in Nigeria for 18 years, where she encountered many difficulties. She was nearly killed on more than one occasion by storms and falling trees. She learned to communicate in the local language, Ibo. She was serving in the rebel state of Biafra during the civil war and suffered great hardship and was on the last flight of evacuees before the territory was overrun by Government forces. On her return to England, she worked with the staff of CMS at the college in Birmingham for two and a half years, before returning to Nigeria for another three years. Her role was to teach clergy wives English, Bible knowledge and Church History. After Nigeria, she returned to teaching in this country until her retirement.

Beatrice has also served the church tirelessly in this area too. She worked well with both young and old to share the gospel message. At St Saviour's, she ran the choir for a short time, was a pastoral visitor in Harden and a member of the Mothers' Union. She started the Outreach group jointly with Astrid and she would also visit other churches to give talks about the work of CMS.



It was a joy to see her celebrate her 100th birthday, still in her own home in Harden, amongst her friends. Soon after, she moved to a nursing home near Middlesbrough, closer to her family where she settled in and was held in great affection by all the care staff.

Beatrice has served her Lord selflessly and generously throughout her life and has now gone to be in his loving presence for eternity. We can look back on her life and service with gratitude and many fond memories, knowing that she is now at peace with her loving Lord — and let us also hold her family and friends in our prayers at their loss of a remarkable lady.
